PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Mr. Rick Sanfratello suggested to the Town Board that the Town's Solar Law be amended. He had a couple of recommendations including:

- Increasing the set back from 30 feet to 100 feet
- Would like to see our guidelines tougher, helping with negotiations when the time comes
- Amend landscaping requirements as they are very vague, being more specific will prevent companies from doing the minimum and will help in being good neighbors
- Would like to see more than 75% after 2 years, this should be 100%. Letting one out of four trees die should not be acceptable for our Town.
- Our Solar Law states the Town Board would approve shrubs and landscaping it should be approved by a landscape architect, someone with experience.
- With a little tweaking we can make this law better for the citizens of Elba.

Councilman Coughlin invited Mr. Sanfratello to a Planning Board meeting. Supervisor Hynes asked Mr. Sanfratello to provide a list of the changes he is recommending. He would be willing to work with the Town to make these changes.

Mr. Chuck Hoover continues to talk with Hecate and several attorneys to gather information regarding solar. Supervisor Hynes stated Councilwoman Marshall is lining up information on a couple of other attorneys who have worked with solar plans and municipalities. Mr. Coughlin said they had three people attend the meeting from Forefront, they have changed their blueprint a bit.

Highway

Mr. Yungfleisch shared the following:

Assessor

Mr. Flansburg sent the following report for the Town Board:

"Attached is the first report from the New York State Department of Taxation and Finance for the calculation of the Town of Elba 2021 equalization rate.

The A Class is the residential properties. The trend is +6%. This is the trend for all towns in Genesee County. This means the State feels that the average home in Elba is currently under assessed by at least 6% and looking for increases in 2021 of that much or more to stay at 100%. As they fill in the chart, the last column will be the projected 2021 equalization rate if no values are changed for 2021/ I will distribute the chart to everyone every time the State comes up with another trend on the chart.

I have already started making increases for 2021 All land categories are going up \$200 per acre. The acre that a house sits on will be going up \$1,000.00. Sales of homes have been going really high. Ten homes have sold since March 1st. The combined 2020 assessment of those homes was \$1,209,700.00. The combined sales price of these homes was \$1,816,900.00. This averaged 50% above assessed value. This is the date the State uses to determine that values are too low. I plan on sending out change notices in March once the State determines I have raised values enough to get 100% for 2021.

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Exemption renewal forms will be sent out in November for Ag renewals and Aged renewals. STAR is now done by the Sate off of NYS tax returns."

Councilman Augello said this was an unfair assessment of Elba property values. Councilman Coughlin shared that it is fair to say if we had an overabundance of houses than it would be cheaper, but this is not a growing community. Supervisor Hynes stated that these numbers are being pushed down from the State and unfortunately, there is no property for sale to build houses in Elba.

ZEO/CEO

Mr. Mikolajczyk's report was emailed to members of the Town Board and is also available in the Town Clerk's office.

Town Clerk

Town Clerk Werth reported that she took in \$646.00 and remitted \$606.00 to the Supervisor for local share, \$40.00 to NYS Ag. & Markets for spay/neuter program.

The Elba Betterment Committee is hosting Christmas in the Park again this year. Councilmembers will chip in to participate.

Supervisor

Supervisor Hynes reported the following:

- The Court Clerk has resigned. The Town Judges for Elba, Oakfield and Alabama will start looking for someone to fill this position. The Town of Alabama recently signed an IMA to have their court proceedings at Oakfield as well.
- Planning Board notes Supervisor Hynes has spoken with Mr. Chuck Hoover regarding the overlay plan that Hecate Energy has proposed. She believes the Planning Board will advise the Town Board not to sign it. They would rather look at each company plan. It is important to be consistent with each company.
- The Town finally received approval from the Comptroller for increasing the maximum amount to be expended on Water District No. 2 enabling us to move forward with Phases 7. Supervisor Hynes has been in touch with John Alessi, Jeff Smith and Town Attorney Dave Schubel regarding the bond and BAN.
- Town Attorney Dave Schubel will soon be retiring. He has agreed to see the Town through the Water District 2 project and will help until we have someone in place. Supervisor Hynes has been given a few attorneys to look into.
- Environmental Construction Group was the successful bidder for the new Town Hall abatement project. They should be in and out quickly.

Councilpersons

Councilman Coughlin asked about the Blue Sky project. Supervisor Hynes says they are working on it and working with DEC.
